

The Belgian Competition Authority approves the acquisition of sole control over XLG Home and La Maison des Services by Management Competence Center (TRIXXO)

On 23 April 2026, the Belgian Competition Authority (“BCA”) approved the acquisition of sole control over XLG Home and La Maison des Services by Management Competence Center (hereinafter “TRIXXO”).

The concentration was notified on 13 April 2026, and the application of the simplified procedure was requested.

TRIXXO is active in Belgium in the provision of domestic help services through the service voucher system, under the names “TRIXXO Dienstencheques” and “Home Maid”. These services include, among others, cleaning, ironing, cooking and grocery shopping. TRIXXO forms part of the TRIXXO Group, which is active in the temporary work sector in Belgium and the Netherlands and is also active in the real estate sector in Belgium. The group has 103 offices in Belgium, spread across Brussels, Flanders and Wallonia.

XLG Home is active in Belgium in the provision of domestic help services through the service voucher system. The company is responsible for the recruitment, employment and support of domestic workers, as well as for the administrative and operational organisation of these services. XLG Home has 25 offices and is active in Brussels, Flanders and Wallonia.

La Maison des Services is a social insertion undertaking in Belgium that provides domestic help and related social services through the service voucher system. The company combines economic activity with a social objective. La Maison des Services has 13 offices and is active in Brussels, Flanders and Wallonia.

In its decision of 23 April 2026, the BCA found that the conditions for the application of the simplified procedure were met and that the notified concentration did not raise any objections.
